Boy Scout Pilgrimage April 22, 2017 Oyster Bay, NY

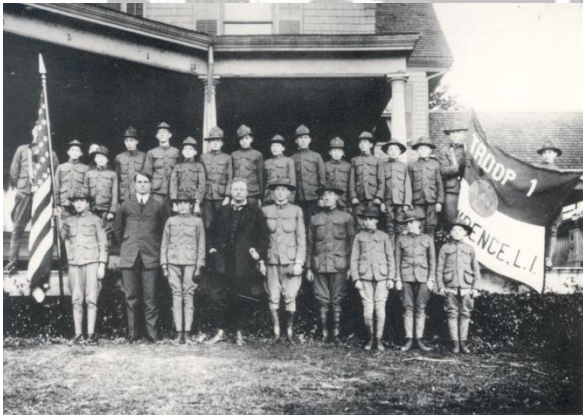


This pilgrimage follows a tradition started after Theodore Roosevelt's death in 1919

After laying a wreath on Theodore Roosevelt's grave a pilgrimage will follow to Sagamore Hill, the Oyster Bay home of the Old Lion, TR.

Thousands are expected to attend sign up today.

Theodore Roosevelt always had a special relationship with Scouting in Nassau County, he was the first Council Commissioner and a significant influence on the development of the Boys Scouts of America.



The ceremony and procession to Sagamore Hill National Park (1.4 miles) will honor TR and mark the centennial celebration of Boy Scouting in Nassau County.

There will be commemorative patches and activities for the entire family to include a demonstration of horsemanship from the Rough Riders, tours of the Sagamore Home and Museum, Native American Dance demonstrations, a Theodore Roosevelt and Lord Baden Powell reenactor to give speeches and take photographs with and an opportunity to work on a Junior Ranger Program.
